Raja Ravi Varma's work, as that of one of our greatest modern artists, was richly prolific and profoundly influential. He sustained and popularized the Indian aesthetic tradition through contemporary Western techniques and the technology of the time.

HIS WORK

In a brief lifespan (1848-1906), his realistically-detailed contemporary figures and religious and mythological themes won the lasting regard of his countrymen and women while fascinating the international art community.

He made his work more accessible and affordable by lithographically printing his paintings, using the best German equipment and technicians. This proved a farsighted step: prints of the Hindu pantheon, figures from the epics, found pride of place in thousands of homes all over India. These lithographs are the subject of this exhibition.
