The retrospective exhibition of Karnataka's first woman artist to hold a doctoral degree, Dr. Dravid was inaugurated in the gracious presence of Chief Guest Mr. Rahul Dravid, the celebrated cricketer, Dr. Pushpa Dravid and Ms. Priyanka Mary Francis, Director of NGMA, Bengaluru, the retrospective exhibition received an overwhelming response from senior artists, family members, friends, art lovers, and visitors. The exhibition, "Srishti," underscored a lifetime of artistic oeuvre and exploration. The retropective highlighted her eminence in use of color, expressive line work, and her ability to blend traditional Indian aesthetics with modern art movements.
